## History of the Camden East Cemetery

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## **Introduction by Mr. Lawrence O’Keeffe**

The Village of Clark’s Mills was first organized in 1787 and was named in honor of Charles Pratt, Earl of Camden, and Lord Chancellor of Great Britain in the late 18th century. One of the first permanent settlers was Albert Williams in 1800 who was the son of a United Empire Loyalist family. The first saw mill was built in 1818 by Abel Scott, and the village grew rapidly over the subsequent fifty plus years. In 1832, the post office was built, and the name of the village was changed to Camden East. The Village was one of several centres located along the Napanee River in the 1800’s that housed a significant number of local businesses and forestry mills due to the forestry industry dominating the area.

In the Fall of 2019, efforts by the Riverside United Church congregation and Camden East residents to declutter and clean the extensive overgrowth in the Camden East Cemetery. This work became a labour of remembrance in recognition of the lives of these early settlers in the village of Clark’s Mills. In response to this work, and as a resident of the area, I began to research the history of this particular cemetery. Our research led to the Lennox and Addington Public Archives, located in nearby Napanee, Ontario, along with a host of local libraries in the area. I interviewed several long-time residents of Camden East and the surrounding hamlets of Newburgh and Yarker. My efforts led to the compilation of a host of data that included numerous maps, early surveys, census records, and photographs of Camden East from the early to late 1800s. It was from this incredible trove of information that I was able to draw together an extensive history of the peoples of this region. My research was further enhanced by the discovery of a cemetery burial record dated 1997. Using that record, I was able to confirm names, gravestone inscriptions, and most of the birth and death details for eighty interments.

In the Spring of 2020, and supported by Kyle O’Keeffe, I was able to map out the various plots in the cemetery, verify known inscriptions and work extensively on the more difficult gravestones to verify their inscriptions. At the same time, we were able to explore the area for underground gravestones. It was to our surprise that we discovered an additional thirty-six gravestones.

### Brief History of the Camden East Cemetery, Camden East, Ontario

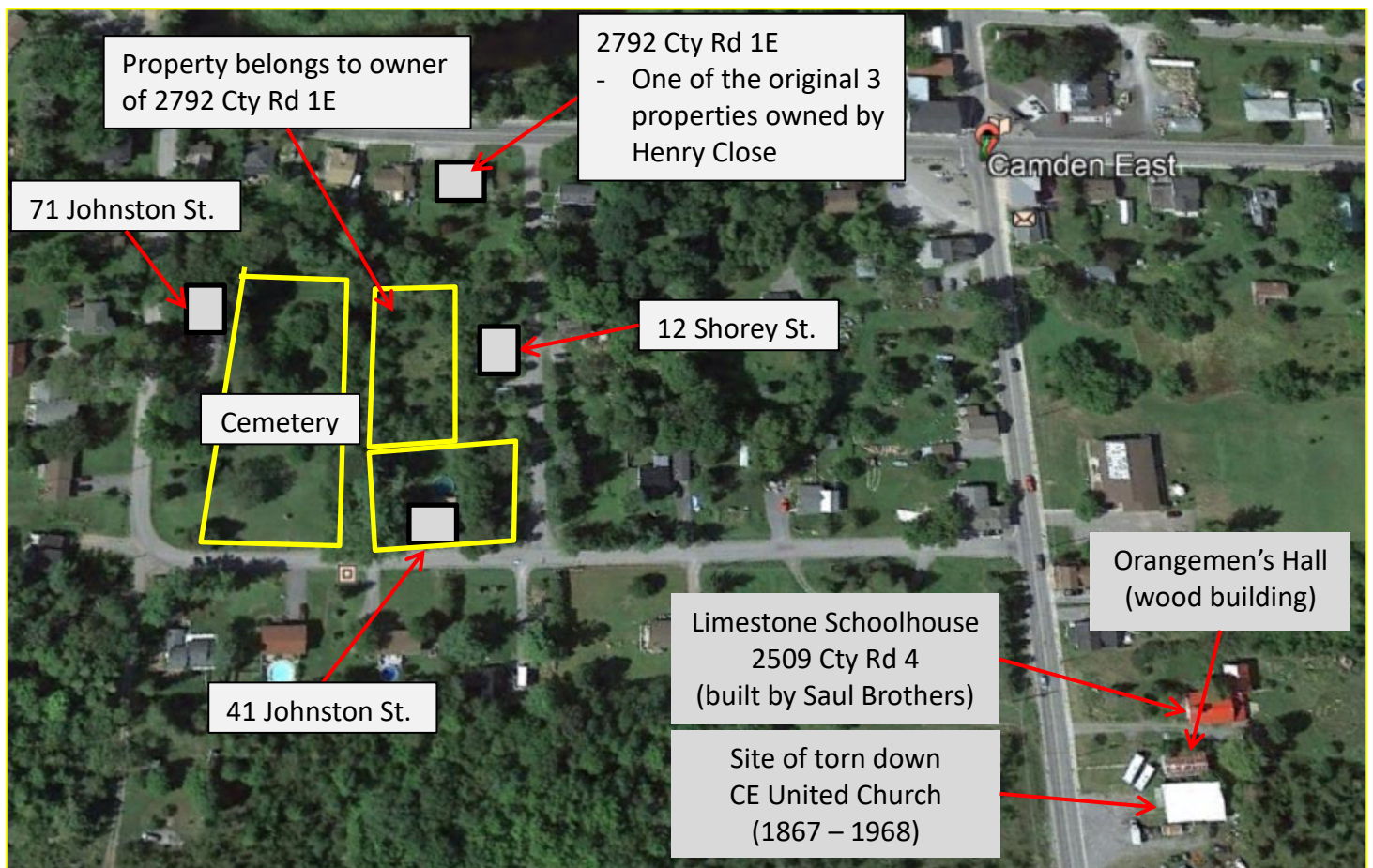


Figure 1: Aerial View of Cemetery and Adjacent properties (Google maps; 2019)

The property's legal description is Plan 88, Block K, Lots 4 and 7 that are located on the south side of County Road 1E in Camden East and at the southwest corner of Johnston Street as illustrated in Figure 1 below. The GPS coordinates for the cemetery are 44.333511,-76.835303.

The two properties combine to form the cemetery that measures approximately 120' x 300', more than one-half of which is an open grassed area.

As seen on the aerial view on the previous page, the following two photographs are of the old Camden East schoolhouse and the Orangemen's Hall that was located beside the schoolhouse. The Camden East Methodist Church was located to the south of these two buildings on the adjacent lot where a workshop building is now located.

According to historical documents, the Camden East Cemetery has been in use since the mid-1800s, and it was originally associated with private citizens and not one of the churches in Camden East. The earliest recorded burial was in August, 1823. At some point in the late 1800s, the cemetery was used by members of the community and the Methodist church that later became the United Church in 1925. The church was demolished in 1967, and after that time, and for reasons unknown, the cemetery was not maintained for several years until the Riverside United Church, located in Yarker, took over its care and maintenance. Since all historical records and exact burial locations were apparently lost in a local fire, the date and details of which are unknown, and prior to Riverside United caring for the cemetery, no official burials have been permitted in the cemetery for

many years. Two burials were permitted in the early 2000's because large family plots and their burial markers were clearly identifiable.

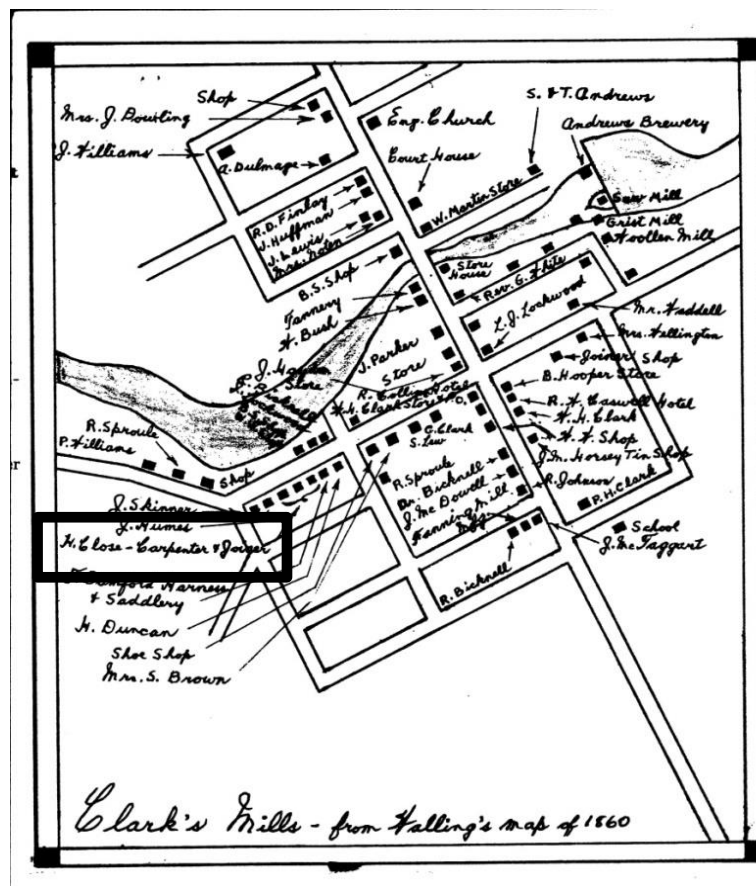


Figure 4: Adjacent properties owned by Henry Close, 1860

According to Lennox and Addington County archival documents, the cemetery property was owned in 1860 by Henry Close who was a local carpenter and joiner. He also owned three adjoining properties (Block J, Lots 2, 3, and 4). See Figure 4 below. Although there are no official records, it is surmised that the Close family used the original cemetery (Lot 4) as a "friends and family" cemetery that was very common in the 1800s. It was also determined that Mr. Close did not belong to the Methodist nor Anglican Churches in Camden East. According to 1800's Census Records, Mr. Close moved to Saratoga Springs in New York without his wife or family and died there in 1886.

The Clark's Mills Methodist Church, which later became the Camden East United Church in 1925, was demolished circa 1967 because of declining numbers and financial insolvency. The decision to close the church was made by the central United Church of Canada during a time when many smaller churches were closed across Canada.

Based on numerous interviews with current, older churchgoers and long-time residents in Yarker and Camden East, there are no records or recollections that the Camden East United Church ever joined with Riverside United Church. In fact, given the very small number of remaining members in the Camden East congregation when the church was demolished in 1967, the church members split between the Newburgh United Church, Napanee United Churches, and Riverside United Church.

### **Caring for the Cemetery**

As a result, the cemetery was left without an operator, and it was left unmaintained for many years until Camden East residents conducted a cleanup some years ago in the 1980-1985 timeframe. At this point, there is a significant gap in records up until the 1990s's when Riverside United took over the maintenance (i.e. grass cutting) of the cemetery. The cemetery underwent a major cleanup in September, 2019, by the Riverside congregation with support from Stone Mills Township. Stone Mills Council agreed to have the Township take over maintenance of the cemetery in a letter to Riverside United Church dated March 24, 2020.

### **Completing the Story and the Mystery of the Cemetery**

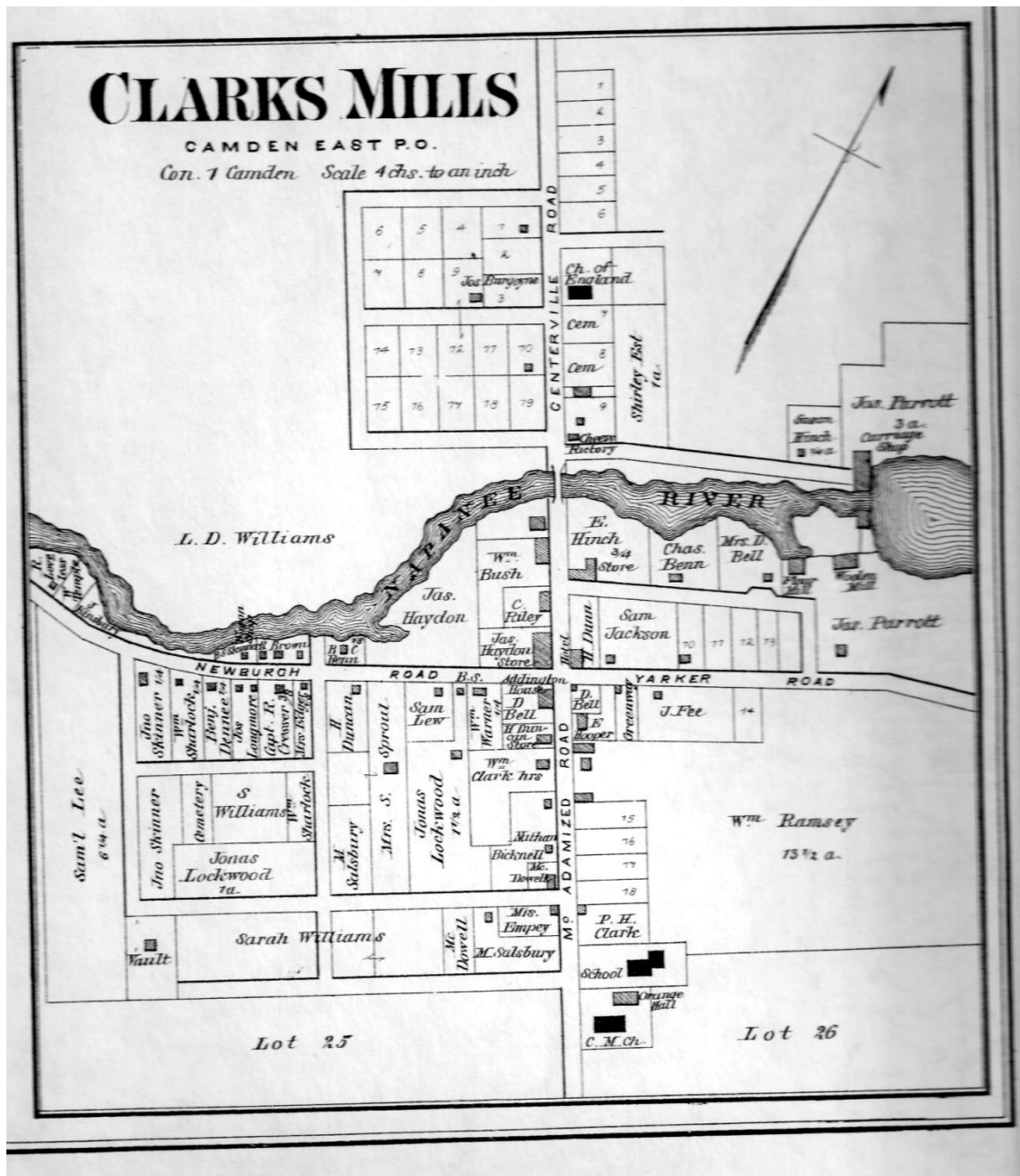


Figure 5: Survey of Clark's Mills circa 1878

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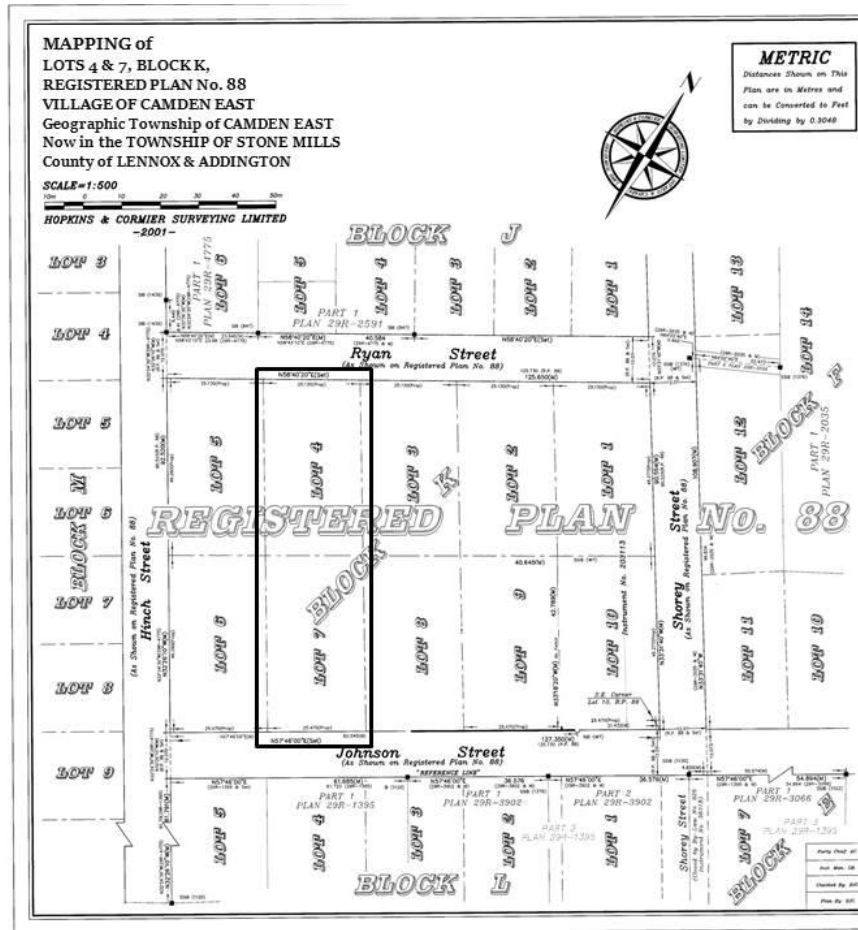


Figure 6: Extract from the 2001 Survey of the Adjacent Property

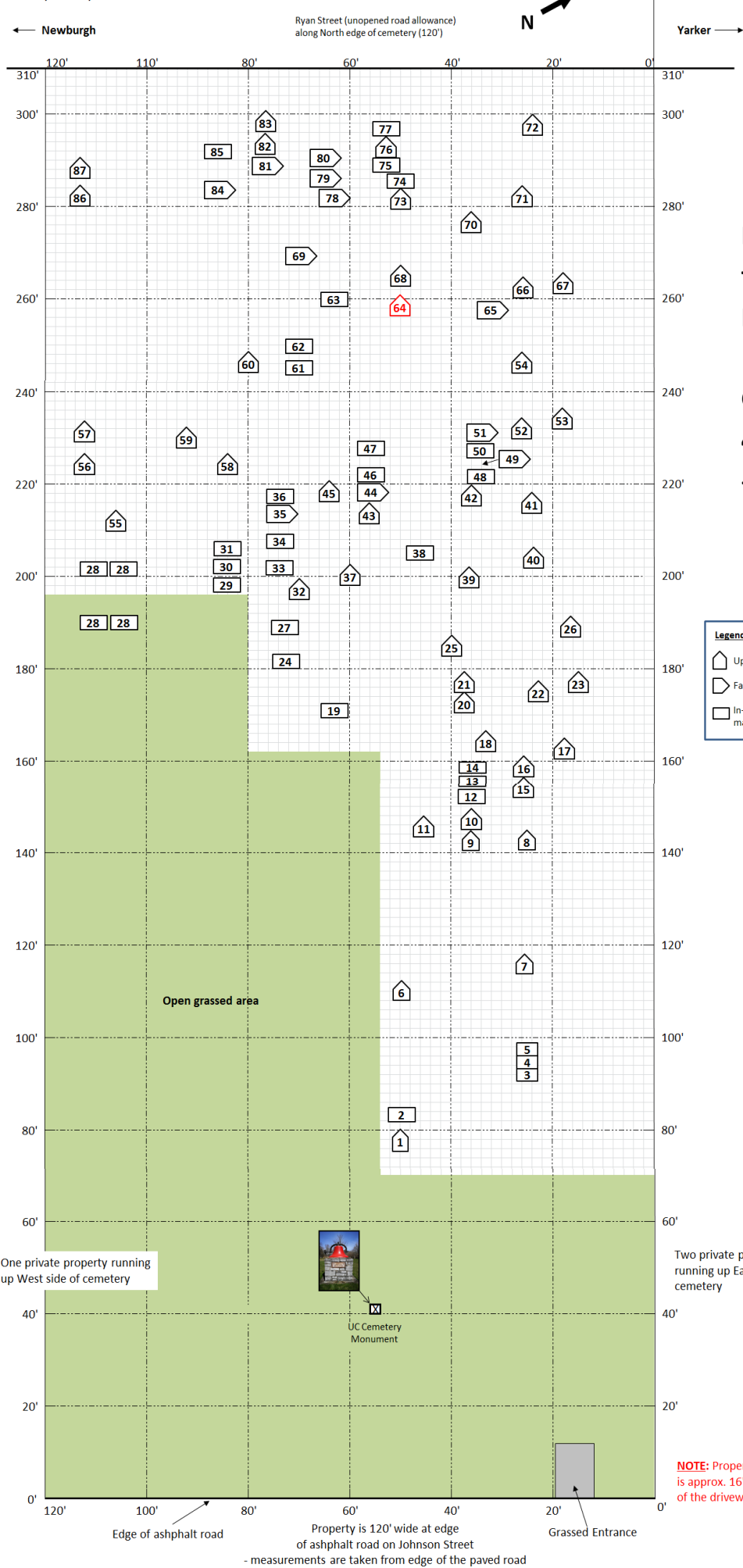
Figure 7: Results of Land Title Search (October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019)

In the process of researching this cemetery, and using one of original survey maps (Figure 5 on the following page), and a more recent survey map (Figure 6 on page 8), it was determined through a land title search with Service Ontario in October, 2019, (Figure 7 on page 8) that the original title is still Deeded to Henry Close and has been since 1865.

## **Remembering Our Past**

During the Winter and Spring of 2020, Mr. O’Keeffe, with significant help from Kyle O’Keeffe undertook mapping the cemetery, transcribing gravestone inscriptions, unearthing hidden plots by manual probing, photographing the gravestones, and completing a database (*using Microsoft Excel*) of all known and available information.




**Figure 8: Map of the Cemetery and Interment Sites**

Figure 8 on the following page is a grid map of the cemetery and the approximate location of the eighty-seven known interment sites.

The following records are listed in alphabetical order according to the location on the cemetery map (Figure 8) found on the preceding page. Note: There is a two-part enlarged map as Figures 9A and 9B found on pages 34-35. The majority of the inscriptions were transcribed from a 2007 written record. Although a number of gravestones were found by probing the area, it is uncertain whether all of the burial sites have been identified. Surprisingly, there were a number of sites that lay buried 4-6 inches under the sod. The unknown plots are listed on page 33. The oldest, and perhaps the first, interment is that of George Williams who died on August 12, 1823, at the age of 8 months. This interment site is marked with a red marker (#64) on the cemetery map. **Appendix 1** (pages 36-41) provides images and explanations of most of the recognizable gravestone markings found in Camden East Cemetery.



Figure 9A: Enlarged Map of the Camden East Cemetery (Part I)

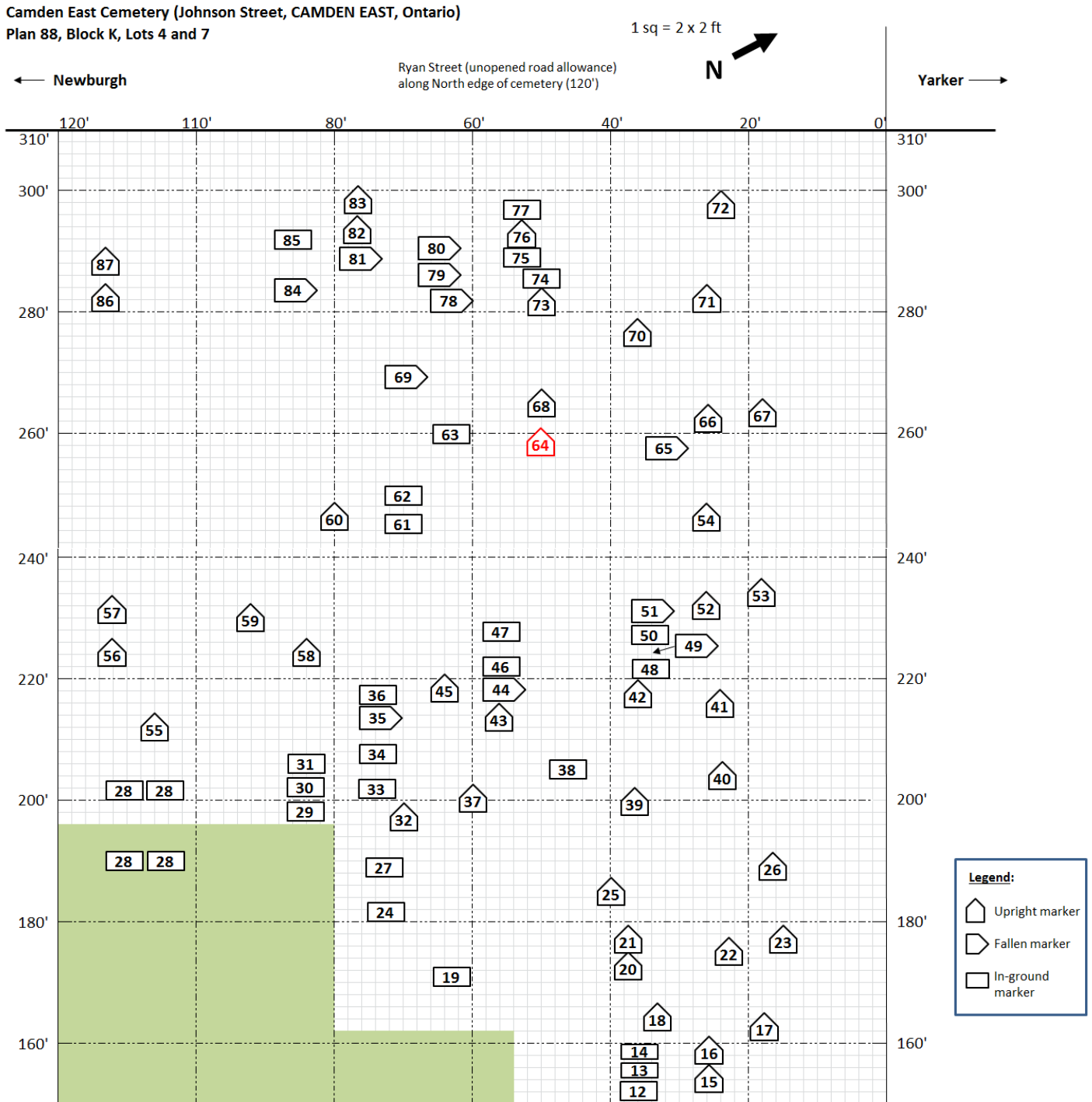
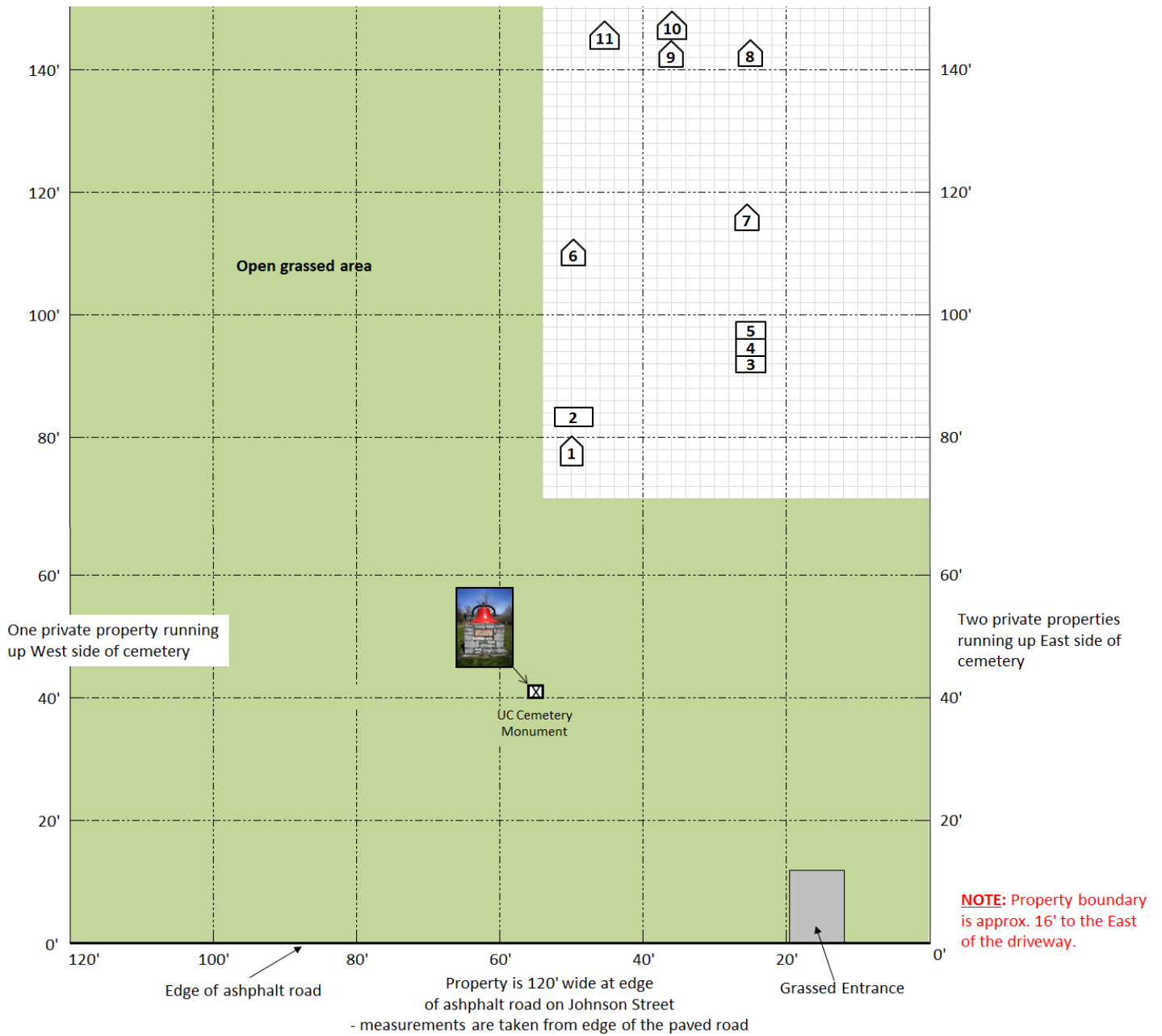


Figure 9B: Enlarged Map of the Camden East Cemetery (Part II)

**Gravestone Markings found in Camden East Cemetery**





The majority of the following symbols are found on the gravestones in the Camden East Cemetery. The meaning of each of the symbols was derived from a variety of Christian-based sources from around the world. There are a large number of websites that provide illustrations and interpretation of gravestone carvings. The following website is only one example:

	<p>The <b>IHS</b> that is seen on the cemetery monument plaque, is more commonly “<b>I.H.S.</b>” or “<b>I.H.C.</b>” The “<b>I</b>” stands for Ihsus or Ihcuc, the name of Jesus in Greek with the S and C being variant forms in the Greek alphabet. When these are found on tombstones, it stresses the identity with Jesus Christ.</p>
	<p>A <b>Buried gravestone</b> often represents mortality.</p>
	<p><b>BOOKS</b> were often carved onto the headstones of clergymen or church ministers, and were also found on the gravestones of devoutly religious people. It can also symbolize the person's love for literature, and represent his good deeds and accomplishments in life.</p>
	<p>The <b>FOUR-LEAF CLOVER</b> is the symbol of Ireland because legend has it that St. Patrick, the country's patron saint, brought it to the emerald isle. The <b>FOUR-LEAF CLOVER</b> represents the Trinity—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.</p>

	<p>The <b>FOUR-PETAL FLOWER</b> represents walking the path of faith and trust.</p>
	<p>The <b>FREE MASONS' SYMBOL</b> (square and compass) – member of the stonemasons that is one of the oldest activities and professions in human history.</p> <p>The compass and the square measure things, so they symbolize judgment. They also represent geometry, and the union of the sky (the compass's circle) and the earth (the square). The letter "G" in this symbol represents God, geometry and geomancy.</p>
	<p><b>GRAPES</b> seen on a headstone are linked to the blood of Christ as they are used to make wine.</p>
	<p>The <b>IVY</b> (5-point leaf) represents friendship and memory.</p>
	<p><b>LAMBS</b> are representations of Christ, 'The Lamb of God.'</p>

	<p>The <b>HAND WITH FINGER POINTING UP OR DOWN</b> - A hand with the index finger pointing up symbolizes the hope of heaven, while a hand with the index finger pointing down represents God reaching down for the soul.</p>
	<p>A <b>HAND POINTING DOWN</b> sometimes represents a sudden death.</p>
	<p>The <b>HANDSHAKE</b> or <b>CLASPED HANDS</b> are a farewell from earthly life and welcoming the soul into God's kingdom.</p>
	<p>The mighty <b>OAK</b> symbolizes longevity, strength, and power. It also symbolizes eternity, as the <b>oak</b> produces many acorns that grow into more <b>oaks</b>, thereby continuing the "family."</p>
	<p>The <b>POPPY</b> is an especially popular symbol, and it represents consolation and sleep; hence death represented as a long sleep or eternal rest.</p>

	<p><b>ROSES</b> on headstones may mean beauty, purity, young love or death in youth. <b>ROSES AND LILIES</b> intertwined represent the frailty of mortality.</p> <p>The <b>ROSE</b> itself symbolizes love, hope and beauty. <b>Two roses</b> joined together signify a strong bond and is sometimes found on the grave of a couple.</p>
	<p>The <b>SHAMROCK</b> represents the Holy Trinity or the deceased having had Irish family roots.</p>
	<p>A <b>STAR</b> may symbolise eternity or immortality and divine guidance.</p> <p>For early Christians, the <b>five-pointed star</b>, or pentagram represented the five wounds of Christ and the star of Bethlehem. The <b>letter "G"</b> usually found in the center is said to represent the "geometry" or "God."</p> <p>The <b>SIX-POINT STAR</b> generally represented the power of God's creation. The two intersecting triangles may represent the delicate balance between man and God.</p>
	<p><b>THISTLES</b> may represent Scottish family roots, endurance and victory and may also represent love that endures suffering.</p>

	<p>The <b>INVERTED TORCH</b> is a true cemetery symbol, symbolizing life in the next realm or of a life extinguished. A <b>lit torch</b> represents life, immortality and the everlasting life, and the "soul is still burning in the afterlife."</p>
	<p>The <b>WEeping WILLOW</b> has long been associated with mourning, grief, and earthly sorrow</p>
	<p>The <b>WREATH</b> indicates memory or victory over death.  The <b>LAUREL WREATH</b>, especially when fashioned in the shape of a wreath, is a common symbol, and it can represent victory, distinction, eternity or immortality.</p>
